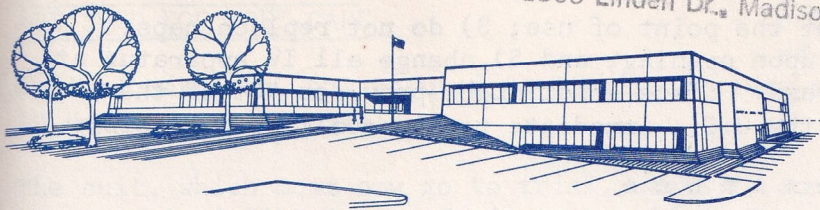

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## WHA HEADQUARTERS BUILDING IS 30 DAYS AHEAD ON CONSTRUCTION

In spite of record snowfalls in Madison, work on the new WHA Headquarters Building is now about a month ahead of construction schedule.

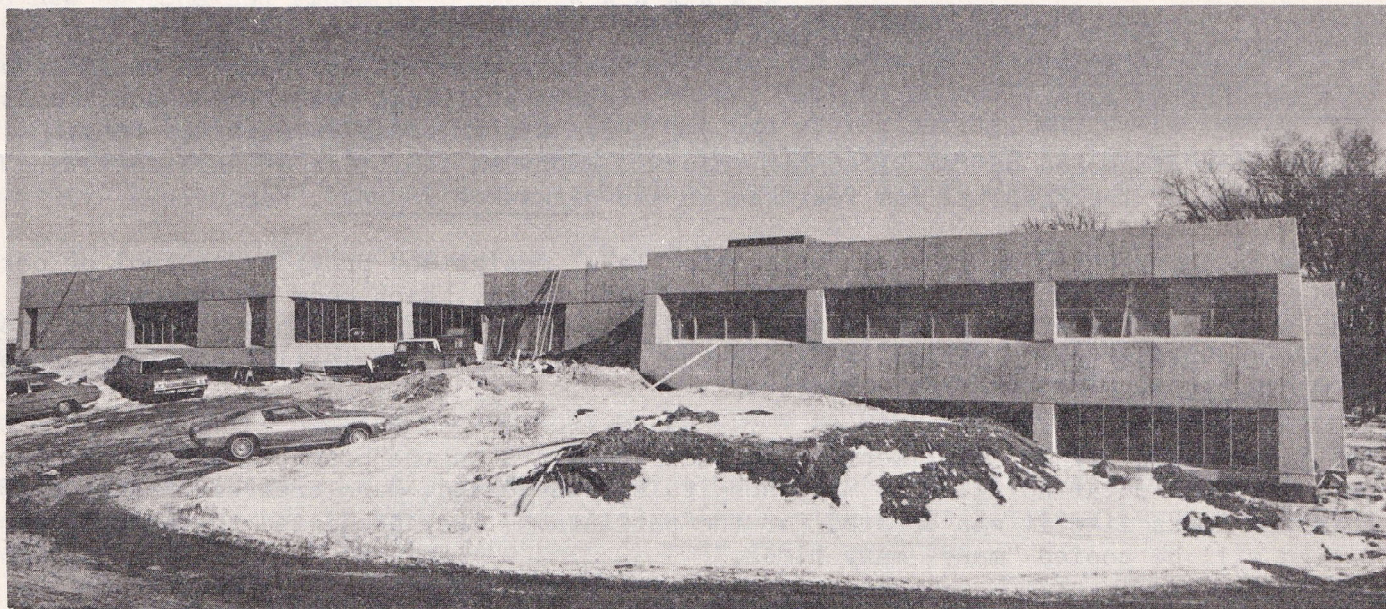

## INTRAVENOUS APPARATUS IS FOUND TO BE CONTAMINATED

The Federal Center for Disease Control has discovered that five deaths and 130 cases of septicemia are "directly attributable" to parenterals produced by Abbott Laboratories, it was announced March 13. Products involved were produced since February, 1970, and bear codes beginning with 842 and 855. Until the possibly contaminated Abbott products can be replaced, CDC and the Food and Drug Administration recommend that hospitals using these products take the following precautions: 1) avoid damage to the caps, which are tentatively identified as the source
