

Vote on Tuesday, November 5



Election Day is next week, Tuesday, Nov. 5. WHA's grassroots advocacy program, the Hospitals Education & Advocacy Team (HEAT), reminds you to make your voice heard and VOTE in this upcoming general election.

Individuals who are registered can vote absentee in-person (early voting) at their municipal clerk's office now through Sunday, Nov. 3. Check your [municipal clerk's office](#) for hours. Remember: If you are not registered to vote, you can register the day of the general election at your polling place. Just remember to bring your photo ID.
